

# Bank of Canada 75th Anniversary

I found a back issue of the National Post and it was fascinating to read the various articles published on this day about the 75th anniversary of the Bank of Canada.

There was a series about the list of governors, a suggestion that perhaps R. P. Bennett was not all that bad after all, and another biased piece called "75 years of funny money".

Interesting to note that nowhere in those musings was it mentioned what the Bank of Canada was responsible for and did for the country between 1935 and 1974. During this period the cost of WW11 was paid for and the social network of Canada was established and paid for by the Bank of Canada at virtually no expense to the people of Canada. This was because all the money required for the establishment of such things that we used to enjoy such ⇒

as the public medical system, pensions, road systems across Canada, to mention but a few of those social networks was created with money from the Bank of Canada at very low rates of interest. # Former diplomat Fowler slams 'special interest' foreign policies

MONTREAL — Former Canadian diplomat Robert Fowler has slammed Prime Minister Stephen Harper's foreign policy, accusing the Conservatives of pandering to Canadian Jewish voters with a "reckless" Middle East policy that blindly favours Israel.

He also said Canada does not deserve a seat on the United Nations Security Council; that the Afghanistan mission is doomed to failure; and that Canadian politicians nowadays pursue foreign policy goals only to "corner the ethnic vote" in Canada.

"The world does not need more of the kind of Canada they have been getting," Fowler said in a speech in Montreal on Sunday morning. "Canadian governments have turned in-

Fowler made his remarks at a weekend "thinkers" conference organized by the Liberal Party of Canada. With Liberal leader Michael Ignatieff and former prime minister Paul Martin in the room, Fowler also indicted their party, saving Liberals are embracing an "infinite array of special interests in order to shill for votes" and that "they will endorse anything and everything which might return them to power." But harsh as those comments about his hosts were, Fowler

was brutal in his assessment of the Conservative government's foreign policy. [...]

# **Economic Bubbles and Financial Crises, Past and Present**

I have spent some fifty years studying economic cycles and teaching international finance, but I had never seen the likes of what we witnessed and experienced over the last three years. That's because such financial crises

seem to happen 60 to 75 years apart.

It is a fact that the outbreak of this severe worldwide financial crisis two years ago was a surprise to many people. For instance, it was widely thought that financial crises, and the severe economic recessions and sometimes depressions they provoked, were really a thing of the past thanks to the protective net of financial regulations that was designed in the 1930s to prevent a repeat of such financial collapses. But here we are again, mired in the most severe economic crisis since the 1930s. We may ask why?

The main reason is that the U.S economy, but also most of the world economy, has been subjected to a financial experiment, over the last some 10 years, which has turned sour. In fact, it has turned into a financial fiasco.

Indeed, it must be understood that a completely new type of banking finance was invented; but all the risks involved had not been properly assessed. For a while, the debt pyramid was allowed to grow, but it collapsed when its shaky and unsound foundation disintegrated.

Of course, there have been similar financial collapses in the past, (notably in 1873, in 1907 and in 1931) and the overall cause is always the same: the financial sector takes too much risk and becomes overextended, creating in the process a debt load for the economy that is unsustainable.

Let's consider a striking fact of today financial situation: The debt load imposed on the economy is even higher today than it was in the 1930s when total debt

reached the level of some 300% of the annual production or GDP. Well, today, the ratio of total debt to the U.S. Gross Domestic Product (GDP) is close to 400 percent.

Keep in mind that it took nearly 20 years to bring this ratio down to about 140, in 1952.

What this means is that today it takes about \$4.00 of debt to create one dollar of economic activity while it took only \$1.40 of debt in the early 1950s to create one dollar of GDP activity. This shows how complex the financial system has become. The question that remains to be answered is whether it will take 20 years to lower the debt ratio from 400% to, say, 200%!

This all shows how this can be devastating for the real economy when financial flows are disrupted and when credit becomes difficult to obtain. Sadly, this is our situation today: Investors and producers have a lot of problems financing their new investment projects. This is a big monkey on the back of the economy and it is an important cause of current, and possibly future, economic stagnation. But before looking into the future, let's review quickly the main reasons why financial crises arise. Why, in other words, the financial tail is sometime allowed to wag the economic dog.

1. First, the question of deregulation. Too much optimism, overconfidence or simple naiveté sometimes allow the development of some form of risky Ponzi-scheme finance. And, this is pretty much what we have seen over the last 10 years. Under the old traditional financial rules, a bank or a credit union would collect deposits or borrow in the open market, lend this money to investors, keep reserves for contingencies, and would hold onto the loans until maturity.

For big banks, at least, this is no longer the model. With the merging of investment banking and commercial banking after 1999, traditional financial rules were pushed aside ⇒

and they were replaced with the rules of asset securitization through which large banks ceased being banks to become brokers, that is they ceased being lenders to become sellers of sophisticated new securities. More about that later.

Under these new rules, a bank still accepts deposits or borrows in the open market, but it does not hold on to the loans it makes. Rather, it takes a bunch of heterogeneous loans made by itself or by others, repackages and slices them up, and sells them as investment vehicles to third parties. That's what is called the "securitization" process; it is a sort of sausage machine that takes one type of securities at one end and transforms it into another type of securities, a more risky one, at the other end. — Large Banks have become large financial sausage makers!

In other words, the financial chain has been made longer, much longer; but, as with all chains, its overall strength is not better than the strength of its weakest link. And the new financial products turned out to be the weakest links. They were toxic financial products.

**2. Why were such new banking rules adopted?** Why were they so risky and dangerous? And how did they lead to the near complete collapse of the credit system in the fall of 2008? These are fundamental questions.

And, as for most questions, there are short answers and there are long answers. I have four short answers:

**First**, they were very profitable to the mega-banks for a while because the banks raked in large fees on the new financial products.

**Second**, the politicians were persuaded to let them "innovate" with the new leverage finance by removing most regulation that would have prevented the banks from doing what they were doing.

**Third**, it led to irresponsible lending because the lenders were no longer risking their own money but the money of far away investors.

And, fourth, the moral dimension cannot be neglected. Indeed, it took a lot of corruption and a lot of greed to create such a mammoth crisis. —[Greed was even glorified in the 1987 movie "Wall St." in which Michael Douglas, playing the character of financier Gordon Gekko, says: "Greed is good, Greed is right. Greed Works." This was the prevailing ideology at the time.] This is an issue that I explain more fully in my new book <a href="The Code for Global Ethics">The Code for Global Ethics</a>.

For a financial crisis of this magnitude to occur, it takes two kinds of corruption or fraud. (I don't delve here into the kind of intellectual corruption that supported the ideology that markets can do no wrong or that they are always "efficient". In fact, markets are very imperfect; they are often under the control of monopolies or cartels, and sometimes, they do not function at all.)

In the first place, politicians have either to make mistakes or worse, to be in the banks' pockets and do what people with money (who want more money) tell them what to do. **Continue reading online**:

# **Economics without Ethics**

In a letter dated January 22, 2010, MP Pierre Lemieux defended his boss's decision to prorogue parliament and insisted that he, personally, was working as hard as ever. He further stated that the number one concern of people in our riding is job security, economic de-

velopment, and the economy and so the time is being utilized to focus on the upcoming budget to address those concerns. How did he reach his conclusion about our number one priority? And what, exactly, do those words mean? Let's investigate.

For this future to happen, I think what is needed is a set of core values constituting a social contract. Our culture, the

# Canada's New Deal: a Social Contract for the new millennium

We, the people of Canada, hold these things to be fundamentally true and desirable. These are our core values. This is our social contract. Individuals and the institutions that serve them must enter into this contract.

- 1. Our society shall be democratic, socially responsible and ecologically sustainable.
- We shall be governed by only independents (MPs), and without political parties and their whipped votes. A bloc or whipped vote by our MPs is an assault on democracy and the people.

- 4. If we cannot breathe, drink or touch the output of these things, they are toxic to us and alternatives, whose outputs shall be wholly drinkable, breathable and touchable, shall be developed. Imagine directing all our energies to this goal instead of space exploration, war, the production of tomorrow's garbage, and entertainment. There is a saying, wherever you go, there you are. If we bring our current beliefs to other worlds, then we will kill their planets, too.
- Canada shall, in 20 years time, shift our entire economy from oil-based to hydrogen-based, and/or other clean, sustainable energy.
- 7. We will Say No to reckless population growth, and No

- to immigration to feed the growth machine: No to bigger cities, to both intensification and sprawl: if Canada's population ages and jobs go begging, we refuse to grow our population for the sake of minimum wage, retail jobs, or greedy residential and commercial developers and bankers who hold the mortgages. We are not locusts.
- 8. We will not throw away or dump our people, the elderly, the addicts, the runaways on the street to become beggars and prostitutes in the name of competition or efficiency.
- 9. Interest rates beyond 5% shall be deemed usurious ex. Credit cards. Violators shall be prosecuted.
- 10. We condemn the stock market of today and demand its reform. This is really a secondary market ruled by speculators who flip tens of thousands of stocks a day. Make stocks only tradable every three or six months, to encourage real investment and discourage speculation.
- 11. No bank shall issue stocks on the stock market. Banks already have investors called depositors.
- 12. There shall be No investment in mutual funds or other schemes that invest outside of Canada, no foreign investment at all, since this means the exploitation of foreign workers and land at their expense and ultimately at ours. It is false economy to build offshore, if it means that Canada loses jobs, and our communities sink into economic and social ruin.
- 13. Canada shall not trade with human rights violators, even if their names are Saudi Arabia or China, or other purveyors in human misery.
- 14. Trade must complement our economy, not compete with it.
- 15. "Everyone has the right to a standard of living adequate for the health and well-being of himself and of his family, including food, clothing, housing, medical care and necessary social services, and the right to security in the event of unemployment, sickness, disability, widowhood, old age or other lack of livelihood in circumstances beyond his control" (UN declaration of human rights).
- No person shall be made destitute, or indebted, for receiving medical treatment in Canada. This includes dental treatment.
- 17. Our hospitals and clinics shall not turn away any patient in need of treatment because of their status, be it financial, racial, ethnic, linguistic, psychological, sexual preference or other arbitrary means of excluding people.
- 18. We shall not eject the mentally ill onto the streets to save money. ⇒

- 19. 100% of all Canada's money created shall be by the Bank of Canada, NOT private banks. All federal government debt shall be assumed by the Bank of Canada. No private or corporate bank shall hold government debt.
- 20. A corporation is a psychotic entity, externalizing all its by-products and growing and absorbing others solely for the sake of profit. All corporations shall be bound by our social contract and shall be have in a social way, eschewing growth and pollution and having a responsibility to the people and communities that support it. The community that houses the corporation and its workers shall receive compensation before its stockholders and executive officers.
- 21. No corporate executive officer shall receive more than 25 times the salary of the lowest paid individual. ALL will share in the rewards and misfortunes of a corporation. If janitors receive 20K, the CEO can only make 500K. This means that if CEOs want more, they can (bloody well) pay their lowest people a better salary. If a company loses money, corporate executives will diminish their salaries first. There will be absolutely no bonuses paid out at such times, unless ALL are paid such bonuses.
- 22. The taxation system shall be reformed so that personal income taxes are calculated on one (1) sheet of paper, and can be done by the average person. Taxation shall be at a flat rate.
- 23. Taxation of businesses shall also be at a flat rate. There shall be no write-offs or accountancy legerdemain.
- 24. Our government shall abandon all efforts to subsidize,

- 26. Likewise, we must have air to breath. No person, enterprise or government has any right whatsoever to pollute it. Nor do our neighbours to the south.

# LENT -- THE SEASON FOR APOLOGÍES

Maybe it's just the season of Lent, the period before Easter traditionally dedicated to repentance and preparation for renewal. Whatever the reason, it seems, suddenly everyone's apologizing for something.

Golf great Tiger Woods went on television to apologize for letting his fans and his family down by a series of extramarital affairs.

British Prime Minister Gordon Brown apologized for the Child Migrant program that shipped children from London slums to the colonies -- theoretically for a better life under adoption, but more often as something close to slave labour.

Halifax Mayor Peter Kelly apologized for the prejudice that banished black people to impoverished communities outside the city limits -- like Africville -- and then, when the land suddenly became valuable, forcibly evicted them.

Warren Chant, CEO of Hotel-Dieu Grace Hospital in Windsor, Ont., apologized -- twice -- for surgery by Dr. Barbara Heartwell that mistakenly removed women's breasts that did not have malignant cancer after all.

Toyota president Akio Toyoda repeatedly apologized to the U.S. Congress and millions of worried car-owners for defects in cars produced by his company, which once enjoyed an unrivalled reputation for quality.

BC Liberal MLA Jane Thornthwaite apologized for impaired driving: "My actions were inexcusable. Drinking and driving is dangerous and completely unacceptable; I know that and make no excuses for what I did," Thornthwaite told the media.

And not one but two federal cabinet ministers had to apologize for temper tantrums in airports. Helena Guergis apparently threw shoes, yelled at Air Canada attendants, and called Prince Edward Island a "hell hole." Four days later, Veteran's Affairs Minister Jean-Pierre Blackburn quarrelled publicly with security guards at the Ottawa airport over a bottle of tequila.

And finally, the Pope himself, Benedict XVI, apologized to the victims of childhood abuse by Irish Roman Catholic priests and leaders.

### **ONLY THE FIRST STEP**

I'd like to think that my church, the United Church of Canada, might have helped to kick-start this process back in 1986 when it offered a formal apology to Canada's native peoples for misunderstanding and mistreating them.

Its example has since been followed by the Anglican, Presbyterian, and Roman Catholic churches of Canada. And eventually, by Prime Minister Stephen Harper, on behalf of the government of Canada, in June 2008.

But what does an apology mean?

The native people gathered for the United Church apology, in 1986, said, in effect, "Let's wait and see."

Because an apology does not automatically generate forgiveness. An apology expresses regret, but not necessarily repentance.

Compensation -- for the Japanese deported from the Pacific coast or the First Nations children incarcerated in residential schools -- is only a short-term solution. It hopes to buy off an injustice with a windfall handout. But it offers no assurance that the social mindset that caused the problem in the first place has learned anything from past experience, or is prepared to change in future.

Without change, an apology by itself is merely a confession, an acknowledgement of wrongdoing. Repentance calls for something more -- a commitment NOT to do the same again.

Our **migration** down the length of Vancouver Island from April 23 – May 9 to give people the opportunity to tell Ottawa wild salmon are essential is building. People have contacted me to plan events in communities far beyond those that we are passing through.

Unless every person who cares about wild salmon stands up and becomes visible to Ottawa, this will not succeed in bringing reason to this situation. You can download posters on the website.

This is not about getting rid of aquaculture; this is about bringing three runaway Norwegian companies into compliance with the laws every other fishery in Canada respects. Salmon farms were exempted from the fishing regulations of Canada in 1993 and these Norwegian companies are lobbying our Members of Parliament to continue these exemptions when they become federally regulated in December. If they succeed, we can give up, they will once again be outside the law.

We cannot possibly manage Canada's wild fish sustainably, if one group is allowed unlimited by-catch of wild herring, wild salmon, rock cod, black cod and other species

in their nets. We cannot have one set of rules that says no fishing with bright lights and then allow fish farms on every major migration route to use these lights, attracting millions of wild fish to their farms.

Scientists studying sockeye don't know what is causing our Fraser sockeye to inexplicably crash, even when cutting back fishing to near zero has not helped. Only the south coast sockeye that migrate past 60 salmon farm sites vanished. These Norwegian fish farmers cannot be allowed to keep their disease outbreaks, on the Fraser migration route, secret any longer. Highly mechanized fish farms will never replace the wild salmon jobs in fishing and tourism, nor can they feed us as wild salmon do.

The tide is turning because of all of you. We will support the small communities we live in to build **land-based aquaculture**. Small independent businesses are much more stable than large foreign operators that come and go based on world markets. Writing this history - <a href="http://tinyurl.com/CLFsemple1">http://tinyurl.com/CLFsemple1</a> - in a short space was a real challenge. But the cat's out of the bag now for every one interested to get basic facts where the language controversy has been for the past four decades.

It should be noted that only a small amount of carping criticism was mounted by the Francophone zealots in Vancouver, because little criticism was possible except for the lack of total equality in the presentations of the opening cere-

# From Chapter 1, CONFEDERATION AND EXPANSION - by Donald Creighton (pp.5-6)

[EXCERPT] The primary aim of Confederation was political - the creation of a great 'new nationality'; and the British North America Act was the result of a political agreement among several provinces, not of a cultural compact of two ethnic groups, English and French.

Before 1867, British America still remained, and was still regarded, not as a cultural duality but, in the words of George Cartier, as 'a diversity of races.' "In our own federation," Cartier declared, "we should have Catholic and Protestant, English, French, Irish, and Scotch, and each by his efforts and his success would increase the prosperity and glory of the new confederacy."

Language was only one of the many components that made up the curious cultural medley that was British America before Confederation. National origin and national tradition – Irish, Scotch, and English, as well as French – might be equally influential; and religion, so often sharpened by sectarian bitterness, was perhaps the most important of all.

The Fathers of Confederation had to take account of these differences; but their great aim was not the perpetuation of cultural diversity but the establishment of a united nation. At the Quebec and London conferences, they gave, on the whole, relatively little time to the discussion of ethnic and cultural questions; and the resolutions they adopted on these matters, though important and essential, were few, precise in their wording, and limited in their scope.

The British North America Act contained no general declaration of principle that Canada was to be a bilingual and bicultural nation – or, for that matter, that it would remain 'a


diversity of races.'

The Fathers of Confederation were as little inclined to lay down the law about the cultural purpose and future of their new nation as they were to issue a general pronouncement on the nature and probable destiny of mankind. The English and French languages were given equal official status in the Parliament and the courts of Canada, and in the legislature and courts of Ouebec. Canada was to establish only two federal courts, the Supreme Court and the Exchequer Court, at Ottawa; and all the other courts in the country were to be provincial courts, constituted and maintained by the provinces. The French language had thus no official standing in the courts of any of the provinces except Quebec; and, perhaps even more important, it was given no protected place in any of the nation's schools. The Fathers of Confederation showed a fair amount of interest in education and its legislative control; but it was very characteristic of these typical British Americans, with their strong denominational affiliations and frequent sectarian biases, that what concerned them was not the role of language, but the place of religion, in the schools. The provinces were given the power to legislate in respect of education; but this authority was limited by some rather complicated provisions designed to protect any rights or privileges concerning separate or denominational schools.

In sum, the distinctive cultural features of French Canada – its language, civil code, and educational system – were confirmed in those parts of the new Dominion in which they had already become established by law or custom. They were not extended in their application to Ontario and the Atlantic provinces. They were given no protected position in the nation as a whole. [END OF EXERPT]

# In Responses to the Last Issue Carbon dioxide versus real pollution problems



Re: THE NEXT BIG SCAM: CARBON DIOXIDE. (CO2)

This is a response to *Dialogue*'s, Feb-Mar, 2010, Page 23, [re markets for tradeable CO2, by Patricia Adams] in which some good points were made.

**History:** World Climate Change Conferences, leading up to the Kyoto

Protocol in Japan, 1997 - 2005:

First, 1992, Rio. 11th., 2005, Montreal. 15th., 2009, Copenhagen, which involved some 192 countries.

Some non-governmental sources have estimated the costs of reaching Canada's Kyoto targets to be huge, ranging from 100% price hikes, to loss of jobs, to \$26,000 per person!

Kyoto's concern about global warming refers to Greenhouse Gases (GHGs), with emphasis on Carbon Dioxide (CO2). It calls for a 30% reduction (240 megatonnes) of GHGs over the period 2008 to 2012 and/or 5.2% or 6% average below 1990 levels, per year, by 2010 or 2012. To the average person, these numbers mean nothing.

Furthermore, the Canadian Taxpayers Federation advises that the UN says Canada has already increased its GHGs from 1990 to the end of 2003, by 24%!

What hope now for any average reduction in Canada, let alone one of 6% below 1990 levels, without massive reduction in our energy production which would have a devastating effect on our economy, resulting in huge increases in unemployment?

Carbon Dioxide is itself NOT poisonous. In fact it is extremely valuable. In the presence of (sun) light, through the process of photosynthesis, it is vital to plants for them to produce the essentials for animal life such as food, wood, fibres and oxygen. In light, most plants inhale Carbon

Dioxide and exhale Oxygen; and in darkness, they exhale Carbon Dioxide. Oxygen of course, is essential for animal life.

Compared to the effect of sunlight, Carbon Dioxide's effect on global warming is claimed to be minute, as is the effect of other GHGs, the main ones of which are:

Nitrous Oxide (NO2). Sulphur Dioxide (SO2). And Methane. These are poisonous.

The main cause of global warming is the effect of sunlight, "Solar Radiation", getting through to the Earth's surface, through depletion of the Ozone layer which has little or nothing to do with Carbon Dioxide.

Over eons of time (millions of years), planet Earth has passed through four major cycles of cooling (Ice Ages) and the offsetting effects of cyclical Global Warmings (going back 2.7 billion years ago), without any influence from mankind at all. This cycle continues today quite apart from human activity.

# I submit, controversies regarding reducing Global Warming and Carbon Dioxide include:

- 1. The DIRECT COSTS, which, some predict, will be absolutely staggering for Canada.
- 2. The complexity of: "Permits", "Credits", governmental "International Credits", "carbon sink credits" (agriculture and forestry), and all their related indirect bureaucratic administrative costs.
- The difficulty for a country such as Canada to prevent cheating by countries outside Canada benefiting at Canada's expense.
- 4. Reduction to global warming compared with the far more significant effects of the sun.
- 5. Concentration on Carbon Dioxide, not air pollution. Air pollution does indeed need to be addressed. But there are ways other than Carbon Dioxide trading for doing this, without the risk of putting millions of people in "developed countries" (such as Canada) into abject poverty.

At the UN Convention on Climate Change in Buenos Aires in December 2004, it was predicted that Canada, Japan and Russia will withdraw from the Kyoto Protocol after 2012.

The KEY QUESTION is: Which will be the higher – the positive benefits from Kyoto type controls, or the negative costs to a country like Canada? We have not been given a clear balance sheet to help answer this question!

The effect of Kyoto will not be felt clearly by the average Canadian in its early stages. But there are predictions it will have a gradual and staggering effect on Canada and future generations down the road.

The majority of the provinces, with Alberta in the lead, have taken the position Canada should not follow Kyoto without a detailed plan agreed to by all the stakeholders involved.

Through International Credits, etc, Kyoto controls will result in significant economic potential being transferred from developed countries, such as Canada, to countries considered not to be developed, such as Russia, China, India, (all of which can afford to have atomic weapons; and Brazil and Mexico. These countries are exempt from Kyoto's GHGs reduction requirements, as they are considered not to be developed countries.

Note how Kyoto rules are like an international game for points. Someone has to referee and control the game! Who is that someone to be? Might we saddle ourselves to yet another bonanza for Canadian minorities, even larger than

our "gun control fiasco", our "sponsorship scandal", or our "Trudeau's official bilingualism millstone" to name a few? Bonanzas at the expense of the significant majority of Canadians. What are the penalties for violation? And who is going to enforce them? And how?

The United States and Australia have opted not to go the Kyoto route. The United States is pursuing its own non-Kyoto alternative, e.g.: Reduction of 18% to poisonous substances, such as: Nitrous Oxide, Sulphur Dioxide, Methane, and Mercury, and other GHGs, by the year 2012, with incentives for complying. This seems to be a more practical and pragmatic approach.

If Canada does comply with Kyoto requirements, will she:
a) Be able to compete with other countries economically when she probably will be required to transfer significant amounts of her own equity (capital), that could otherwise be available for investment in Canada, to "developing" countries, by having to buy "credits", etc, from them? Answer, likely, "No!"

b) Have to sell at disadvantageous terms to foreigners our natural resources (and eventually our sovereignty)? Answer, likely, "Yes!"

Economically, manufacturing may simply become a nonstarter for Canada! And then, if we find ourselves in conflict, or at war, where would we be as far as self reliance and self defence are concerned?

Should we not protect our natural resources, sovereignty, equity, and good health of our citizens, by avoiding the costly, inequitable, Kyoto, which hamstrings our economy, by applying our own controllable clean air requirements, recognizing Canada's unique conditions with a relatively small population in a huge land mass with extreme climates; and concentrate on alternative sources of energy, such as: Nuclear? Organic? Wind? Solar? Tidal? Geothermal (heat pumps drawing water from deep underground)? And Hydrogen?

# How can we stop the HST?

Introduction to the Citizen Initiative Petition Citizen Initiative Petition to repeal the HST What is the HST?

The HST (Harmonized Sales Tax) is a new federal sales tax created by merging the GST with the PST, to be collected by the federal government and shared with BC.

# Why is the HST bad for BC?

- It will add 7% more to the cost of many goods and services that were previously exempt under the PST.
- It will transfer the entire sales tax burden from businesses to consumers.
- It will cost the average household in BC an extra \$2,100 per year.
- The HST removes BC's exclusive Constitutional right to set and collect provincial sales tax in BC.
- The BC Liberals' promised NOT to implement the HST in the last election.
- BC's economy is struggling, and an extra tax will hurt citizens and economic recovery.

# How can we stop the HST?

BC is unique in Canada to have a Citizen's Initiative law that provides for a legally binding petition to be conducted. Fight HST has been approved by Elections BC to conduct a Citizen's Initiative petition to repeal the HST.

The Citizen's Initiative petition requires the signatures of 10% of registered voters in every one of BC's 85 Electoral Districts to be successful. If the Initiative petition is successful, the BC Government must submit a draft Bill to the Legislature for a vote, or conduct a province wide referendum (Initiative Vote) on the question.

### What is the petition called?

The Fight HST Citizen Initiative is titled: An initiative to end the harmonized sales tax (HST)

### What does the petition mean?

The purpose of the initiative draft Bill is to declare that the agreement between the federal government and BC to establish a harmonized sales tax (HST) is not in effect. The draft Bill would reinstate the 7% provincial sales tax (PST) with the same exemptions as were in effect as of June 30, 2010.

The draft Bill is retroactive to June 30, 2010. The Bill proposes that the provincial share of HST revenues received between June 30, 2010 and the date of Royal Assent of the Bill that exceed what would be collected under the PST rules as of June 30, 2010, would be reimbursed to British Columbians on a per capita basis.

### When does the petition start?

The Fight HST petition will start on April 6, 2010 Signatures must be collected within 90 days, ending on July 5, 2010.

# Former premier leading the fight

Delta – Fresh on the heels of a resoundingly successful trip to Northern BC, former BC Premier Bill Vander Zalm, leader of the Fight HST petition to repeal the HST, brought his Town Hall Tour to the Okanagan and the Kootenays, Mar. 27-31, to expand awareness for his petition, and to sign up more volunteer canvassers.

"We signed up over 350 new canvassers at our meetings in Northern BC last week," said the charismatic former premier, "We now have somewhere between 2,500 and 3,000 volunteers across the province, and they are pouring in daily."

Vander Zalm says wherever he goes, Finance Minister Colin Hansen seems to follow. "He showed up in Merritt two days after I went there. Then he tailed me to Dawson Creek and Fort St. John. I think we gave him the slip somewhere between Prince George and Smithers, but he'll probably find us again on this trip. Must be tough doing damage control for a tax that 85% of British Columbians don't want."

"It would be a lot easier and less costly for all concerned if they just started listening to the people who elect them, rather than trying to convince everyone to accept a tax they don't want," Vander Zalm said.

Vander Zalm's petition requires the <u>signatures of 10% of registered voters in all 85 electoral districts to succeed</u>. "We need as many volunteers spread out across the province, since a shortage of signatures in even one riding means the whole petition is invalid. That is why the Okanagan and Kootenays are so important. Without them, there can be no success."

# What the Hell Am I Doing Here Anyway?
